The Gingrich Homestead Cemetery

The 1740's Gingrich homestead is located on Mt. Pleasant Road, South Annville Township, Lebanon County. This was the farm of Yost (Joseph), which was passed to Yost's third son, John Henry and then on to John's son Aaron Gingrich. The Gingrich family graveyard was located in what is now the pasture. About eight or nine tombstones were dug up, cleaned, photographed and registered at the Lebanon County Historical Society. The tombstones were reburied 275 yards away at the farm lane entrance at Mt. Pleasant Road and a new marker, with thirteen names, was erected.
