

E. Frank Pethick

Edgar Frank Pethick, 58, formerly of Hancock, died suddenly at his home at 624 West Manlius Street, East Syracuse, at 6:30 a. m., Thursday, July 12, 1951, a victim of coronary thrombosis. Mr. Pethick was sitting at the breakfast table when seized. He died immediately. Deceased was born on August 27, 1892, in Carbondale, Pa., a son of Edward and Catharine (Bone) Pethick. On June 2, 1917, in Carbondale, he was married to Miss Sadie Hunt and the following year they moved to Hancock where they resided until moving to East Syracuse, 10 years ago. Three years before leaving Hancock the Pethicks lived on the Pennsylvania Side where he operated the former Virgil Whitaker sawmill now owned by Mr. Pethick's son, Edward. Mr. Pethick was employed in the maintenance department for the South-Lock Screw Products Company. He was a member of the Hancock Tent of Maccabees. Funeral services were conducted at the Henderson Funeral Chapel, Hancock, at 2:00 p. m., Sunday, July 15th. Rev. Addison J. Horn, pastor of the Hancock Baptist Church, was the officiating clergyman. Burial was in Riverview Cemetery, Hancock.

Bearers were William Bull, Albert Lewis, Raymond Wadsworth, Charles MacLeod, Lester Rowe and Robert Barton, all of East Syracuse and co-workers of Mr. Pethick. Surviving Mr. Pethick are his wife, two sons, Robert, at home, and Edward, of Hancock; one granddaughter, Patricia Pethick, of Hancock, one niece and one nephew and several cousins.
